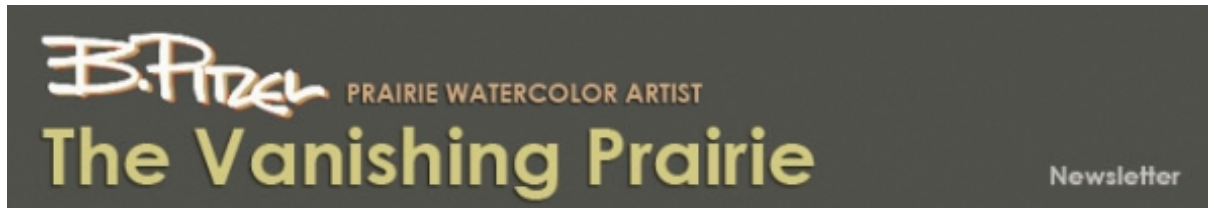

Bob Pitzel - A Touch of Green, 19 x 25 (inches), framed to 28 x 34 (inches). Only portions of the green paint remains to identify the maker of this old implement that stands abandoned in a pasture East of Watson, Saskatchewan. The harsh winter sunlight casts patterns of darks and lights accenting the variety of shapes in the tractor.

My escapades have taken me to a few of my favorite haunts this year, where I have revisited familiar places and discovered new insights into our vanishing landmarks. It seems you can walk by the same place numerous times over the years and each time there is something significant and different about that space that draws your attention. It could be shadows created by the late afternoon light on a fence line, machinery touched with the last bit of winter
